## A Word from Brad Horne:



### Hankering Bread During the Coronavirus

I've been home now for about 2 weeks during the "shelter in place" declaration and have eaten my fair share of bread, especially my wife's homemade bread. I've been thinking about bread more often than usual.

Bread is popular around the world and is one of the world's oldest foods. It takes 9 seconds for a combine to harvest enough wheat to make about

70 loaves of bread. Poor Ruth, it would have taken her a whole year!

Napoleon gave a common bread its name when he demanded a loaf of dark rye bread for his horse during the Prussian campaign. "Pain pour Nicole," he ordered, which meant "Bread for Nicole," his horse. To Germanic ears, the request sounded like "Pumpernickel." Napoleon would no doubt be surprised to learn the modern world still uses the phrase he uttered so many years ago!

When living overseas, I often worked with students practicing English. When meeting for the first time, I would introduce myself as Brad. They would tell me they thought it was a great name because they ate it all time. One guy actually said, "I eat you." That is when I realized that they thought my name was "bread!" I've lost count of the number of times I had to politely tell someone that my name was Brad and not bread!

Bread is mentioned 253 times in the Bible, and so it is very important. The Israelites were supernaturally provided manna in the desert for 40 years, and Elijah was supernaturally provided bread in Zerephath. Jesus was tempted with turning a stone into bread but said to Satan that man does not live by bread alone. It takes more than just bread to live.

Then Jesus says in John 6 that He is the bread of life. Manna only provided temporary physical life. The Israelites ate it, and eventually died. Jesus is a Bread of a different kind. He is from heaven and gives life.

A person who eats of that bread will not die.

Jesus said that they must eat his flesh and drink his blood, which grossed them out. I believe that Jesus was not talking about the Eucharist or Lord's Supper, since that was not instituted for another year at the Last Supper. Eating the living bread was a figure of speech that meant believing in Him, like listening to him and seeing him. It was another figure of speech when Jesus said we must drink "His blood". Leviticus said that "You must not eat... any blood". But blood was also understood as a means of atonement. It is the blood that makes atonement for one's life. Those who eat the living bread (believe in Jesus) and drink his blood (believe in His atonement) have found eternal life. Like the song says, "Give Me Jesus".

Now I have a hankering for some soft, homemade bread!

The number of hours and miles invested in this compassionate ministry is, in Mason Dixon's opinion, astounding! Since April 4, the Rearichs have accrued these volunteer stats:





Erica: 147 hours, 338 deliverydistribution miles John: 6 hours, 30 delivery-distribution miles Abigale: 31 hours, 3 miles (biking delivery) Ella: 88 hours, 3 miles (biking delivery) Total masks distributed as of 4/13 is a whopping 531! All from one family!

The hours accrued include cutting material, assembling and sewing masks, and delivering to anyone in need of them. Besides delivering to people's home, they have delivered masks to the local police stations and fire department.
