A Word from Brad ~

Words are NOT an Option

For the first 6 months that I lived in Pennsylvania, I was not able to talk with my neighbor up close due to COVID. We would shout to each other across the street, which made it difficult to share my testimony and the gospel with him. We got to know each other through those "across the street" conversations. He knew that I was a Christian and he even said that I was a "good guy". He knew that I was a former missionary to Russia and that now I was working with churches in the area.

My neighbor and I finally decided that we could get closer in proximity to one another because we were tired of shouting across the street. Soon afterwards, we were talking, and I asked my neighbor if he had ever read the Bible. He replied that he had only read a few verses. I asked him if he would like to read the Bible and he said, "Sure, why not."

Since agreeing to read the Bible on November 9, 2020, my neighbor has read almost 6 books of the New Testament, including two of the gospels.

Could this have happened without words? Would my neighbor have started reading the Bible just because I was a good person? Jesus didn't just come to this earth and live as a good person as a testimony to others. He was constantly preaching and teaching the good news.

I think we need to live a good life, but without the words of life, people won't be able to believe. Faith comes from hearing. In the book of Acts, ten times it says that they heard, they believed, and were baptized. That's the model. People have to hear in order to believe. This is the sole reason God has left us here on earth: to go and make disciples. Let's go and tell so that people can hear about Jesus, and when they put their faith in Him, their eternity is changed. That's good news!
