A Word from Brad ~

Title: Thermometer vs. Thermostat

These days we are experiencing a new phenomenon with this pandemic. We have to have our temperature taken with a thermometer before we board an airplane or visit other places, whereas before, we only had our temperature taken with a thermometer at the doctor's office. The thermometer measures our body's temperature; a thermostat regulates a particular temperature. The thermometer is a reflection of what is currently happening, but the thermostat dictates what the environment should be.



Our body actually has a thermostat called the hypothalamus. When we are too hot the hypothalamus dilates blood vessels, activates sweat glands, and accelerates our breathing. When we are cold, the Hypothalamus constricts blood vessels, causing our muscles to shiver, creating heat, and increases our body's metabolic rate.

So, what are you talking about Brad? Why are you giving us a biology lesson?

As Christians we often act like a thermometer and go with whatever the topic of the conversation is at the time. I believe however, that we need to be thermostats. We should dictate our environment by setting the tone and topic in our conversations with unbelievers.

Jesus acted like a thermostat over and over again by setting the tone in conversations to what he wanted to talk about. A great example of this is found in Luke 13. Jesus is told about Pilate killing two Galileans, and then himself mentions the story of the tower in Siloam that fell and killed eighteen people. Most of us today would have responded with sorrow, grief, or possibly sympathy and prayer for the families of those that died as they grieve the loss of a loved one.

But Jesus didn't do any of that. Jesus responded with the words of an evangelist. He dictated the conversation. He turned the conversation around from bad news into good news. He set the tone and used this opportunity to share the way to eternal life. Jesus repeats his own words twice just in case they missed his point, "But unless you repent, you too will all perish." When was the last time you used those words when you were told that someone had died?

So, the next time you talk with someone, be a thermostat instead of thermometer in your conversations. Set the tone and turn bad news into good news. It's a matter of eternity when someone hears, and their eternity is changed. I hope the people that heard Jesus' words that day repented, and I'll be able to meet them in Heaven when I arrive! I know my destiny because someone acted like a thermostat and shared with me the good news.
