A WORD FROM BRAD ~

Doers, Not Merely Hearers

Here is a good self-examination question. Is the Sunday morning church service the only part of your church that you are involved in?

Fifty years ago, most church members were active and involved with ministry. Churches tended to be smaller and so everyone knew everyone. There was peer pressure for everyone to be involved in helping in the different ministries of the church.

What about today? Are churches filled with attenders that are more hearers than doers?

Many churches today have at their core many elderly, which brings wisdom. I've heard some say that they know what to do, but don't have the energy to do it. The average age of our KBA church member is probably somewhere in their middle to late 50's.

The letter of James says, "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." James is refreshingly practical and includes 54 imperatives in his 108 verses. Doing over just having faith. This letter deals more with the practice of the Christian faith than with its precepts.

Jesus calls us to be disciplers. Jesus said that if we want to follow Him, we have to die daily and follow Him. John 15 says that if we abide in the vine (Jesus), we will bear much fruit. If we are not abiding in the vine, we will not bear fruit.

James says that if we are merely hearers, we deceive ourselves. The word for "deceive" is literally "reasoning beside or alongside" or "beside oneself". This word was used in mathematics to refer to a miscalculation. Professing Christians who are content with only hearing the Word have made a serious spiritual miscalculation.

James mentions that the word of God, the Bible, is like a mirror. How often do you look at a mirror? Men, maybe twice a day and women, let's just say more than that. The mirror shows us exactly what we look like. In the same way, the Bible shows us what our hearts look like. It shows us the truth.

We also need to not be just "doers", being busy doing something, but "doers of the Word." What does that mean? A person who is a doer of the Word is a person who is being obedient to what Jesus has called us to do as believers. God has left us on this earth for one reason, to share the good news, to do the work of an evangelist.
