# **NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES:**

<u>Thompsontown Baptist</u> also hosted a community outreach backpack giveaway on Friday, August 5. The event was held at Haldeman Park in Thompsontown and also featured face painting and free hotdogs and chips. Backpacks with school supplies were given to 48 students, grades K-12. After running out of backpacks, names were taken, and an additional 19 backpacks were delivered to homes the following week. What a blessing!

Pastor Tim stated, "Someone tried to shoot silly string up my nose. But we had a great week, and our volunteers were awesome."



<u>Stewartstown Baptist Church</u> youth traveled to Huntington, West Virginia, to serve with World Changers. In total they brought 15 adults and students to help the Huntington community by building wheelchair ramps, painting damaged buildings, fixing broken fences, and being a spiritual influence on everyone they interacted with. Pastor Chandler Robinson shared: "Overall, the trip was a great success, with multiple opportunities to share the gospel and pray for those who are a part of Huntington."

# WORD FROM BRAD ~ Calling for a Decision

In life, there are times that people are undecided. That's where advertising comes in. It can help them make up their mind. There are people sitting on their couch at home and they are undecided about what they will eat for dinner. Then a commercial for a local pizza place reminds them that they can have hot pizza delivered to their home in 30 minutes. Advertising. Helping people make up their mind and come to a decision.

As believers, we need to help people make up their minds as far as spiritual decisions that need to be made. We need to be like a modern-day Elijah, asking people to think and make a decision as to whom they serve.

1 Kings 18:21 says, "And Elijah came near to all the people and said, "How long will you go limping between two different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal, then follow him."

Elijah called them out. He asked them to think about who they will serve and then to serve that god. "And the people did not answer him a word." The people were indecisive. Indecision is making a decision.

Being a modern-day Elijah can be challenging. We need to find ways that we can ask people to think and then make a decision as to whether they will serve Christ or something or someone else.

Our family recently took a white-water rafting trip on a family vacation, and I was able to talk with our raft guide, Mike, while we were floating down the calm areas of the river. Mike said that he wanted to wait until the end of his life before accepting Christ. I told him that if he thought it was a good decision to become a Christian at the end of his life, why wait. If it's a good decision at the end of his life, then it's a good decision now. I asked him to make a decision, either for Jesus or for his current life, away from Jesus.

I believe Jesus asked for a decision in John 3, when he told Nicodemus, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." Jesus was giving a choice that needed to be made. We see that in John 3:18, "Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God."

We understand that God only sees 2 kinds of people in this verse; those who believe in Jesus and those that don't.

Let's ask people to decide one way or the other, because it they put off the decision and die before they decide, then they have chosen not to believe in Jesus. Blessings, Brad
