A Word from Brad ~ Being a Witness

When I was 9 years old, I was a mean-spirited bully in the 3rd grade, but I didn't understand at that time that God would someday use my story of how I went from persecutor to preacher. God wants us to be a witness, to share our testimonies, so unbelievers can hear how God has changed our lives and that He can change their lives also.

In the New Testament, the word "witness" is used 181 times. More than one-third of these are found in the works of John—49 in the Gospel of John and his Epistles, as well as 17 times in Revelation.

Jesus gave us the example of what kind of witness that we need to be. In Revelation 1:5, Jesus is called "the faithful witness." Two chapters later, He is called "the faithful and true witness" (3:14). These statements beg the question, what kind of witnesses are we today? Faithful and true?

We need to be faithful and true witnesses and train ourselves to turn everyday conversations into the sharing of our testimonies. Every Christian has a personal testimony of how they became a Christ follower. There are 5 pillars (parts) that we need to remember in sharing our testimonies.

The first pillar is the transition. You need a well-planned and well-practiced transitional statement from an ordinary conversation to an extraordinary conversation. An example of a transitional statement can be something like this: "Have you ever read the most famous book ever written? It's changed my life." Then go on to share the next few pillars.

The next three pillars are three, short, oral statements about your life before Christ, how you came to Christ, and your life since you became a Christ follower. Your personal testimony should be short. I usually tell people my testimony, these three pillars, in less than 3 minutes. Practice, practice, practice your testimony. Don't forget the question at the end of your testimony, which is the last pillar.

The final pillar is the giving of the invitation. It's not just enough to share the information of your transformation, but you have to issue the invitation. "God has changed my life; would you like for Him to change your life?" Or, you can say, "God has forgiven me of all of my sins. Would you like Him to forgive your sins too?" This way, if you don't get to a gospel presentation, you still have a short invitation. Pastor Ed Roman says it like this, "Do you have a story like mine?"

Let's all be intentional and faithful witnesses for our Lord and Savior!
