

## A Word from Brad ~ The Power of Example

“Example is not the main thing in life—it is the only thing.” These are the wise words of the famous medical missionary and author, Albert Schweitzer. He clearly stated the importance and power of example. Schweitzer’s statement is an overstatement, of course. Many other things are involved in a faithful life, but they themselves are all combined into the example someone sets.

I grew up in a home without a fatherly Christian example in my life, but as I became more involved in church, I watched godly Christian men lead their families, and learned what it’s like to be a spiritual leader in the home. It was the power of example. I’m still learning, by the way. I did not know how to witness to people when I was in college, but I watched godly men share their faith with unbelievers. I continue to watch, learn and do. It’s the power of example.

How many of us reading this, have been influenced by the powerful life of some pastor or Christian that we saw early in our lives. If I mention “a faithful pastor,” whose image crops up in your mind?

“Mentoring” may sound like a new concept, but it’s not. God has created us to lead by example. We are to follow God’s example, and to imitate his character. In the incarnation of Christ, God came in the flesh in a way that we could understand and relate to him, and, as Peter said, “leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps” (1 Pet. 2:21).

God planned for parents to follow God and then for our kids to follow us until they understand who God is and can follow Him on their own. This is His instruction to parents. “These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.” (Leviticus 6:4-7) Leading our children by example.

In the Old Testament, God called forth Abraham and his descendants to “be holy because I, the LORD your God, am holy,” in Leviticus 19. They were to be a special, distinct people in the world, giving a godly example. Unfortunately, Israel failed at being a good example to others and God judged the nation in Ezekiel 5.

God has also intended the church in the New Testament to lead by example. In John 13, Jesus said that the world would know that we are His disciples by the Christ-like love that we have for one another. Did Jesus follow someone’s example? This is what Jesus told his disciples. “Jesus gave them this answer: ‘I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does.’” (John 5:19) Then Jesus says 22 times in the gospels, “Follow Me.”

By our lives as Christians, we are teaching each other and the surrounding world about God. We are called to give people hope that there is another way of living than the lives of selfish people. We are to be the light in this dark world, meaning that we are to be the example to the world. Matthew 5:14-16. The power of example.

To pastors, what are our churches teaching the watching world about God? What example are you giving your church members? Do your church members only hear your sermons, or do they see your sermons being put into action? As you share your faith or tell about real life testimonies of you sharing your faith, then they will also share their faith. They will follow your lead. If they see you personally discipling people, then they will do likewise.

Have you noticed that in Paul's pastoral epistles, he seems particularly concerned about the reputation that a pastor would have with those outside the church?

What are we teaching the people that are watching us?

What a tremendous privilege God has given us, and how little we seem to consider it. We must be intentional about what testimony is every one of us providing right now? Think of the great responsibility that we have. Consider what example you set for the world around you. God has a great plan for his people and for this world; He calls us to show that by our words and our lives. Jesus said, "Go and do likewise". Luke 10:37
