A Word from Brad: Being Ready and Intentional

When talking to some Christians about evangelism, I have heard them use 1 Peter 3:15 as an excuse to not be intentional in sharing their faith. Peter wrote, "always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you".

Some Christians say that they are ready to share their faith when someone will ask them. I've been an evangelist for over 30 years, and I'm still waiting for someone to come up to me and ask me about the hope that is within me, but it hasn't happened yet.

First, it's hard to see hope in a person. Unless you have the opportunity to talk a lot with neighbors or colleagues at work, they may never even know that you are a Christian, much less ask you about the hope you have.

Second, I don't believe most Christians are prepared to give a defense to people who ask for the reason for the hope that they have. We must prepare ourselves to give a defense. We must "get ready." Since our hope is evidence-based, based on facts, it is extremely important to learn the reasons for our hope. Peter said, "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God" (1 Peter 4:11). If so, then we must first learn the Word of God. We must learn our testimonies and the gospel. When Jesus was challenged by Satan, He quoted Scripture and used it accurately. When Jesus was challenged by the Pharisees, He logically pointed out flaws in their arguments, while also making reference to an application of the Old Testament. As we go about our daily lives, we need be preparing ourselves so that we will be ready when we have the opportunity to share the hope that is in us.

Third, Jesus and Paul did not go about their days waiting for someone to come up to them and ask for the hope that was in them. They took the good news to the people and preached in synagogues. Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount and preached at every synagogue that was nearby, while Paul went on 3 missionary journeys. They were intentional in taking the gospel to the people and did not wait until people came to them. They should be our examples of what to do in evangelism.

The apostle Paul wrote to Timothy instructing him to "preach the word" and "do the work of an evangelist" (2 Timothy 4:2,5). Paul also desired for Timothy to accompany him on his second missionary journey. That is not sitting back and waiting for people to approach, asking for the hope that we have. That is intentionally: taking the good news to the people.

You might be saying to yourself, "God didn't give me the gifting or call me to be an evangelist." While it is true that not everyone has been given the gift of evangelism, God did call each one of us to fulfill the Great Commission: "Go and make disciples of all nations". If evangelism is truly not your gift, how then will you be intentional using *your* gifting to fulfill His command and go and make disciples? It amazes me how Christians can talk all day about their hobby, or about something they love, but they are silent on sharing their faith. We are natural evangelists of the things we love. "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks." (Luke 6:45)

Throughout the Bible, God pursues people because He loves us, He knows our sin nature is a problem we can't fix on our own, and He know we were made to experience something more.

Let's do the same! **Brad**


News from New Life – Penn State with Eric Reiber
