

Remembering Rev. Larry Douthwaite

Rev. Lawrence "Larry" Douthwaite died Saturday, March 2, 2024. Rev. Douthwaite served in numerous churches and formed Living Faith Evangelical Church in Littlestown in 1995, a member of the Keystone Baptist Association. He was married for forty-nine years to Sharon. They have three children: Aaron (Kim), Diana (Andy), and Brett (Alyssa) as well as six grandchildren who he loved spending time with. Rev. Douthwaite was also known as the "hat man" in Littlestown because of the numerous hats he wore around town and when working as a school crossing guard for many years. He was also a sought-after guide for the Gettysburg



Battleground, impressing those who toured with him. Most importantly, He loved God, preaching the Bible, teaching, helping, and talking to others. A memorial service was held on March 9th at the church with his close friend Pastor Gary Buchman officiating.

A Word from Brad: Easter Greetings!

With Easter around the corner, I've been remembering back to when Jeanine and I first moved to Russia in 1993. We were told that the Russians, both Christian and non-Christian alike, would greet each other with the phrase, Xpuctoc Bockpec, or in English, "Christ has risen".



Easter was one of the best days of the year to witness to unbelievers because I would ask them if they knew the meaning behind the words, "Christ has risen." Sadly, only about half of the unbelievers knew the meaning behind the words.

That got me to thinking. How many American unbelievers understand the meaning of the words often said on Easter, "Jesus has risen", and the answer, "He has risen indeed"?

All of Christianity rests on the very fact that Jesus has risen from the grave. Without the resurrection, as Paul said in 1 Corinthians 15:14, Christianity is all in vain.

This Easter, be intentional about asking your unbelieving friends, family, neighbors, or colleagues how they will celebrate Easter. If they say they aren't going to celebrate it, ask them why not. It's one of the most popular holidays around the world.

Here are some incredible facts that you can share this Easter with the unbelievers that you know.

- 1. Christ's resurrection was prophesied in the Old Testament Scriptures.
- 2. Jesus died by crucifixion.
- 3. Jesus was buried in a tomb.
- 4. Jesus's death caused the disciples to despair and lose hope, believing that he was dead.
- 5. Jesus' tomb was guarded by 16 Roman soldiers
- 6. Jesus's tomb was empty a few days later.
- 7. The risen Christ appeared to more than five hundred witnesses, including Paul.
- 8. The disciples transformed from hopeless to hopeful after the Resurrection.
- 9. The Resurrection of Jesus was the center of their message.
- 10. The disciples proclaimed the Resurrection in Jerusalem, where Jesus was killed.
- 11. As a result of their preaching, the Church was born and grew.
- 12. Sunday became the primary day of worship instead of the Jewish Sabbath on Saturday.
- 13. James, the half-brother of Jesus, had been a skeptic, but converted after the Resurrection.
- 14. A few years after the Resurrection, the skeptic, Paul, was converted.
