


News From Our Churches:

Peggy Harling shares "We were blessed to have some of our missionaries come join us in person for a time of sharing about themselves and their country. We heard







After the morning service, we had a special time together enjoying a potluck lunch and asking questions of our missionaries regarding the strategies they use in sharing the gospel with the people they serve.

A Word from Brad: Reaching the Future Church

Most of our KBA churches do not have youth leaders and many do not have youth in their churches. The majority of our KBA church members are 50 years old and up. What does this say about the future of our churches? We are losing our youth today, and in turn our churches will grow smaller and smaller.

I want to give you some statistics from Barna about youth:

- The church dropout rate among 18–25-year-olds is 64%.
- (59%) of Gen Z (Born 1997–2010) believe "Church is not relevant to me personally".
- 1 in 5 young adults with a Christian background (22%) has left the faith.

But the good news is that 77 % of U.S. teens are curious about Jesus. Pastor/church leader/follower of Christ, guess who knows a lot about Jesus and can tell them all they want to know? You and Me! We can make a difference.So, how are we going to reach youth today? What can we do?

I believe there are 6 Steps that We Can Take to Reach Our Youth

- **1.** We have to pursue the youth of today: Edward Kimball, went to a shoe store, where a member of his Sunday School class worked, and shared the gospel. That 18-year-old became a Christian, and later became the greatest evangelist in the 19th century. His name was D. L. Moody. What youth around you can you reach out to and pursue?
- **2. Second, we have to be intentional:** If we don't plan to reach our youth for Christ, it won't happen. Make a plan, set a date, put it your calendar.
- 3. Third, we have to train up the youth we currently have. For the most part, we who are 50, 60, and 70 will most probably not be able to reach youth. We have to train up the youth in our churches to reach their own generation.
- **4.** Fourth, consider having summer youth interns in your church. When I was a senior in college, my pastor came to me, and asked if I could intern for the church. Those few months helped me fall in love with ministry.
- **<u>5.</u>** Fifth, we need to take our youth on mission trips: locally, nationally, or overseas.
- **6. Prayer.** We need to pray for our youth and pray with our youth.

Let's be intentional about this last step and pray for our youth. I want all of you to take out your cell phones so you can set an alarm on your phone. Right now, please set an alarm to go off every day at either 9:38am or 9:38pm to remind you to pray for the youth. You might be asking, why 9:38. Matthew 9:37-38 "Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

If we all pray together for laborers, God will hear from Heaven! Let's watch Him work! Blessings!
